- We try to do the basic's well




Beef Cattle Policy

- 45% cattle ratio, includes bull beef, dairy support etc.
- Calve November, Wean May, Finish at 24-30 months.
- Mate Yearling heifer
- Historically Angus X Hereford, now mainly Angus
- Purchased Bulls from two sources
- Selected mainly on SRI
- Synopsis of Five Farms




Stock Units +5% Sheep






Producing More Lambs + 25%






Finishing More Lambs +50%






Producing More Wool +50t






Calves Weaned






Average Cattle Carcass Weight kg






Sheep Meat & Beef, + 400t






NI Hill – lambing %






NI Hill - Calving %
